



TEAM MEMBER EXPECTATIONS

To be read and signed by Student and Parent/Legal Guardian

Students and Mentors on Team 247 are held to a very high standard, and are expected to demonstrate behavior and dedication that reflects Gracious Professionalism at all times.

Students and Mentors may achieve this expectation by following these basic guidelines:

- 1. Attendance and Participation** - It is not required that Students and Mentors attend all meetings to maintain membership in Team 247. However, all members should recognize that a team is a group effort, and each person's actions, decisions, and participation affect the outcome of the entire team. As there is considerable cost to maintaining a successful team, each student is expected to actively participate in as many of the team's fundraising activities as well as meet a minimum fee amount in order to participate in team travel events. (Further information can be found in the "Teams Fees and Payment" Document.)
- 2. Punctuality** - Students are expected to read and adhere to the agenda and student schedule that is distributed for each Team event that they attend.
- 3. Minimum Grade Point Average (GPA)** - All students are expected to maintain a 2.5 or higher GPA throughout the third and fourth marking periods in order to be excused from school to travel with the team to competitions and/or team events. Progress reports will be obtained to ensure compliance with this expectation.
- 4. Know and maintain your role** - Students and Mentors and Parents all play vital roles in the development, operation, and promotion of the Berkley, Hazel Park, Shrine High School Robotics Team 247. Each member should know their role, and actively strive to maintain that role.
- 5. Just Ask** - Students and Mentors should view the Berkley, Hazel Park, Shrine High School Robotics Team as an opportunity to expand knowledge and skills, and should not feel intimidated to ask questions or seek information. If any team member has any questions or seeks information, Just Ask, and someone will gladly explain or assist you in finding an answer or solution.
- 6. Opportunity to Learn and Teach** - Each member of Berkley, Hazel Park, Shrine High School Robotics Team will assess every situation, whether positive or negative, as an opportunity to learn. Students and mentors will take the opportunity to educate one another and expand their knowledge.
- 7. Letters of Recommendation** - All team members seeking a letter of recommendation must submit their request in writing, no later than two weeks before the letter is due, along with: Organization/and or direct recipient of the letter, purpose/objective of the letter, due date. In the case where an essay submission is required (such as scholarship applications), the student must also include a typewritten copy of their submission with their request for a letter of recommendation. Students may seek a letter from _____ who will write a maximum of one individual or one combined letter per request.
- 8. Team Captains and Section Leaders** - Students can earn the opportunity to plan an increased role on the team by becoming a Team Captain and/or a Section Leader. Please refer to the Team Captain Agreement or Section Leader Expectations documents for more information.
